



Being a Precinct Election Official

... Polls are open 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. on election day ...

Why am I needed?

Precinct Election Officials help to make sure that an election is fair and impartial according to election laws of the State of Ohio. Election Officials staff and operate the polling locations for Muskingum County Board of Elections on election day.

How do I know if I am eligible?


- You must be a registered voter in Muskingum County.
- You must be at least 17 years of age.
- Have your own transportation.
- Willing to attend paid training.
- You have not been convicted of a felony
(unless the conviction has been reversed, expunged or pardoned.)
- You are able to work from 5:30 a.m. to approximately 8 p.m. election day.
- You **are not running as a candidate** in the election in which you are working.

What do I have to do?

- Presiding Judges are responsible for picking up and returning election supplies to the Board of Elections. Presiding Judges receive **mileage pay**.
- Precinct Election Officials set-up and dismantle voting machines, post materials at polls, verify voter eligibility, assist voters and pack-up all voting supplies after close of polls.
